OFFICE ACTION RESPONSE

In a November 26, 2014 Office Action (the “Office Action”), the Examining Attorney refused registration of Applicant’s mark, Ser. No. 86/362,513 – ESSEX, on the ground that the mark is primarily geographically descriptive as applied to Applicant’s goods within the meaning of Section 2(e)(2) of the Trademark Act.

For the reasons set forth below, the Examining Attorney is respectfully requested to reconsider and withdraw her refusal to register the ESSEX mark.

APPLICANT’S MARK IS NOT PRIMARILY GEOGRAPHICALLY DESCRIPTIVE OF THE ORIGIN OF APPLICANT’S GOODS

The Examining Attorney explains in the Office Action that “Essex identifies a county in New Jersey” and that “purchasers are likely to believe that Applicant’s goods originate in Essex because Applicant is located in Essex County, city of Fairfield, in the state of New

Jersey.” Therefore, the Applicant’s mark is primarily geographically descriptive of the origin of Applicant’s goods.” To support this conclusion, the Examining Attorney cites TMEP §1210.01(a); *see In re Societe Generale des Eaux Minerales de Vittel S.A.*, 824 F.2d 957, 959, 3 USPQ2d 1450, 1452 (Fed. Cir. 1987); *In re Hollywood Lawyers Online*, 110 USPQ2d 1852, 1853 (TTAB 2014).

Applicant respectfully submits that the Examining Attorney’s conclusion that ESSEX is primarily geographically descriptive of the origin of Applicant’s goods is not supported by the law or the facts of this case. In particular, when the test for determining whether a mark is primarily geographically descriptive of the origin of Applicant’s goods is properly applied, Applicant’s mark cannot be deemed primarily geographically descriptive of the origin of Applicant’s goods. Therefore, the refusal to register Applicant’s ESSEX mark should be withdrawn.

A mark is primarily geographically descriptive of the origin of the associated goods if the goods actually originate in the geographic place identified in the mark and the mark (1) has as its *primary* significance a *generally* known geographic place; and (2) identifies products that purchasers are likely to believe mistakenly are connected with that location (emphasis added). *Institut National Des Appellations D’Origine v. Vintners Int’l co.*, 22 U.S.P.Q.2D (BNA) 1190, 1195 (Fed. Cir. 1992). A mark is not *primarily* geographic where the geographic meaning is not likely to be connected with the goods. *In re Nantucket, Inc.*, 213 U.S.P.Q. (BNA) 889, 893 (CCPA 1982). Moreover, it is not enough that the mark is the name of a place generally known to the public. “[T]he PTO must establish that the public associates the goods with the place which the mark names.” *In re Jacques Bernier Inc.*, 13 U.S.P.Q.2d (BNA) 1725, 1726 (Fed. Cir. 1990) (citations omitted). This required association by the general public is commonly referred to as a “goods-place association.”

The Examining Attorney has introduced evidence to demonstrate that the term “Essex” has geographic significance in the form of an excerpt from what Applicant believes to be *The Columbia Gazetteer of the World* and a printout from www.fairfieldnj.org web site regarding the *Township of Fairfield, Essex County, New Jersey*. The Examining Attorney has not, however, established that the term “Essex” has *primary* geographic significance because she has not presented evidence that the public would associate the word “Essex” with the city of Fairfield, in Essex County, New Jersey. Though concededly a county in the state of New Jersey, *The American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language*, a copy attached as Exhibit A, defines “Essex” as “a historical region and Anglo-Saxon kingdom of southeast England. The mark ESSEX could, therefore, just as easily allude to goods originating from Essex County, England. See Exhibit B. It could also refer to any number of cities or other counties in the United States named after Essex, England, such as the cities of Essex in Connecticut, Maryland and Massachusetts and the county of Essex in Vermont. See Exhibit C. The foregoing makes clear that the term “Essex” does not have as its *primary* significance the New Jersey county identified by the Examining Attorney.

The Examining Attorney has also not established why the public would be likely to believe mistakenly that Applicant’s goods, identified by the mark ESSEX, come from Essex County, in the state of New Jersey. In other words, the Examining Attorney has not satisfied the second requirement for finding that a mark is primarily geographically descriptive – namely, the goods-place association. She concludes that the public would be likely to believe that Applicant’s goods come from Essex County, state of New Jersey, without explaining or providing evidence to support her reasons for arriving at this conclusion and without providing any proof that Essex County has any special notoriety with respect to Applicant’s goods as listed in the application.

Applicant’s goods as set forth in the application are “electronic racks; drawers and shelving for mounting to electronic racks; fans and power strips for mounting to electronic racks; rack mounted power distribution systems, namely, electrical transformers and isolation systems for mounting within electronic racks.” Applicant’s corporate office is located in the city of Fairfield, state of New Jersey; however,

in addition to its corporate office, Applicant also owns factories in the states of California and Illinois, as well as the province of Ontario, Canada. See Exhibit D.

Neither Essex County nor the city of Fairfield, state of New Jersey have any renown for “electronic racks.” In this regard, attached are Internet search results conducted for 1) Essex County, New Jersey, 2) Essex County electronic racks, 3) Fairfield, New Jersey, or 4) electronic racks. None of the search results reference Applicant’s goods in association with theses search results. Therefore, Applicant’s mark ESSEX is arbitrary with respect to Applicant’s goods. See Exhibit E.

Finally, Applicant respectfully submits that “ESSEX” is too unspecific to be deemed primarily geographically descriptive. In *World Carpets, Inc. v. Dick Littrell’s New York Carpets*, 168 U.S.P.Q. 609, 612-613 (5th Cir. 1971), the Board found the term “WORLD” to be registrable, notwithstanding the Examining Attorney’s refusal under Section 2(e)(2). 168 U.S.P.Q. at 613. The Board recognized that “WORLD” was far too broad to call to mind any one identifiable place of origin. Like the terms “GLOBE,” “NATIONAL,” and “INTERNATIONAL,” the term “WORLD” was conceivably a geographic reference, but one that lacked sufficient specificity to link it with any one place. Applicant’s mark, “ESSEX,” is similarly non-specific from a geographical standpoint and, therefore, Section 2(e)(2) should not bar registration of this mark. *Id.* See also *Sears, Roebuck & Co. v. Allstate Motors, Inc.*, 110 U.S.P.Q. 485 (N.D.Ill. 1956) (finding “ALLSTATE” registrable); *Century Distilling Co. v. Continental Distilling Corp.*, 23 F.Supp. 705, 38 U.S.P.Q. 105 (E.D. Pa. 1938) (finding “DIXIE” registrable), *rev’d in part*, 106 F.2d 486 (3rd Cir. 1939), cert. denied, 309 U.S. 602 (1940); R. Callman, *The Law of Unfair Competition, Trademarks and Monopolies* 199 (1969) (noting that “NATIONAL” and “INTERNATIONAL” are not geographically descriptive).

For all of the reasons set forth above, Applicant respectfully requests withdrawal of the refusal under Section 2(e)(2) and that the Examining Attorney approve Applicant’s mark for publication in the *Official Gazette*.

History

The name *Essex* originates in the Anglo-Saxon period of the Early Middle Ages and has its root in the Old English *Ēastseaxe* (i.e. the "East Saxons"), the eastern kingdom of the Saxons (cf. Middlesex, Sussex and Wessex) during the Heptarchy. Originally (recorded in AD 527) Essex occupied territory to the north of the River Thames, incorporating all of what later became Middlesex and most of what later became Hertfordshire as its territory was later restricted to lands east of the River Lea.^[1] Colchester in the north east of the county is Britain's oldest recorded town, dating back to before the Roman conquest, when it was known as Camulodunum and was sufficiently well-developed to have its own mint. In changes before the Norman conquest the Kingdom of Essex was subsumed into the Kingdom of England and Essex became a county.

County-wide administration

Essex County Council was formed in 1889. However County Boroughs of West Ham (1889–1965), Southend-on-Sea (1914–1974)^[2] and East Ham (1915–1965) formed part of the county but were unitary
